Full details of the organisation and arrangements of Royal Docks Metals are set out in this policy document which must be brought to the attention of every employee, sub-contractor etc. The Company requires all employees, sub-contractors etc. to work in a safe and healthy manner, to co-operate with all instructions and requirements in order to comply with the law, and not to interfere with anything designed to reduce risks to Health & Safety. All employees, sub-contractors etc. should be aware that they have a legal duty to bring to the attention of the Company any defect or shortcomings in the arrangements for Health & Safety.
